

Episode 22 - INTO BLANK

*Act 1: Burt volunteers that he would not keep the prize money for himself. Goldstriker questions what he means and he says he would distribute it equally to every single person who was involved in the show. To teach Burt the value of money, Goldstriker takes Burt into **the Las Vegas tunnels**, where he witnesses homeless people living in dangerous squalor. With Luke, Burt reflects on how disgusting and wasteful Las Vegas is. Goldstriker hands stacks of money to the fish while discussing the value of money, and Burt namedrops his business, "Gray Enterprises."*

*Act 2: **Goldstriker and Jet take the fish to a roulette parlour, where they gamble the \$50,000 grand prize and lose it.** Back in the RV, Jet and Ben confront Burt with the revelation that Gray Enterprises is tied to Burt's alias, Jim O'Hara, an online scammer. Burt confesses to everything.*

*Act 3: The fish reflect on their time, and share a nice moment sitting on top of the RV. They set out on one last journey, kicking out each person at a different spot in Vegas. Production skewers Burt with increasing intensity as they drive further out of town, and he reflects that he will try to be a more balanced person, and a less vice-filled person in the future. **In the middle of the desert, Goldstriker crashes the RV, takes Burt out and hands him a \$50,000 check, scratches it out, and then abandons him on a hill.***

Act 1

When the fish are underway, Goldstriker asks Burt how he would split the fifty thousand dollar grand prize. Burt says he would give 5 thousand to the four most engaging original contestants: himself, Luke, Alex B, and Mizzy. He would give one thousand to the other eight fish, Payton and Binx included. He would give five thousand to Jobe, Frank, Tank, and Connor as the most engaging freeloaders. To the famous house cast, he would give 500 dollars to Kawan, Turbo, Tony, and Kawan. Sam reminds him he should also pay production, so he adds Vance, Maejok, Cowboy, Ben, and Jet. Sam reminds him to also pay MInts, Wes, Bill, and Steinfeld. Burt decides he will run out of prize money and agrees to pay production out of his own pocket, then.

Goldstriker announces they will be taking the fish into the Las Vegas tunnels, and the risks involved. They say a prayer then head to where the entrance is and encounter a homeless man named Jay, who leads them through the tunnels.

On the walk back, Burt and Luke talk about how Vegas feels cheap and disgusting after their experience in the tunnels. In the RV, they talk about money itself, and Sam hands them a massive stack of money to inspect. Burt drops the name, "Gray enterprises," while talking about his personal businesses.

Act 2

Goldstriker takes the fish to a roulette table. Burt is confused because he does not want to gamble and Goldstriker and Jet remove him from the room. They lose \$50,000 in a roulette bet, and Binx is eliminated for guessing wrong.

Back in the RV, Jet begins to investigate what TTS knows about “Gray Enterprises,” and Burt’s alter ego “Jim O’Hara.” Burt immediately confesses that Gray Enterprises is his tutoring business, where he fraudulently takes online exams for students and harasses people who do not pay him. Jet and Ben question Burt, who willingly divulges the strange details of how he makes his money.

Act 3

The fish reflect as they wake up on the final day, and joke and talk. They gather on the roof of the RV and sing “I got spurs,” and ask each other how they’re feeling.

They peel out of the parking lot and drop Fatty off at a strip club. After Fatty is gone, they observe that Burt resembles a big fat spider, stuck to the wall of the RV.

Binx is kicked out among a crowd of prostitutes. They continue to roast Burt for being over-vaxxed and overmedicated despite being a STD-ridden whore.

Mizzy is left on Fremont St. at Heart Attack Diner. Luke continues his rapport with Burt until it’s finally time to go, at a bus station.

Left alone in the van, Burt reflects that his experience has reminded him to be less overtly sexual, and to find a better outlet for his “boundless” energy. He says he will get his implants removed, and worries the show has damaged his reputation.

The ride becomes increasingly bumpy and dangerous, and Burt screams in terror as Sam drives the RV into the middle of nowhere. Eventually the RV gets stuck, and they take Burt outside and congratulate him with a giant novelty check. They strike out the value of the check and leave him in the middle of the desert, driving away.
