For decades I was serving my country as a civilian expert doing government mandated assignments balancing full time jobs aswell. My expertise in general: culture/history/foreign relations. Most of the usual assignments were trying to "rephrase" our history to

appear more glorious than it is. To spin a newly emerged expedition or artifact to appear more important in history than it actually was... Political PR for the conservative side basically. For example, occasionally I was asked to give a statement about the validity and legitimacy of certain smaller sects coming from neighboring countries (mostly christian). Usually these assignments were mandated because these sects filed for complete exemption from taxes and such privileges.

This is a NATO member country which is not part of the Five Eyes (or UKUSA) partnership. I was never "briefed", I have no top-secret clearance and this country is not really the epicentre of information. There is no way I know details or secrets about the topic at hand. This is just a hunch, a 20 year old memory coming back like a comet.

At one point (a bit more than 20 years ago) my duty (an official gov assignment) was to vet a new movement. The task was to do the due diligence needed to giving out certain rights or privileges to a modern religious-like movement. Speaking fluent english was not really that common here 20 years ago, at least not in my age bracket. I also had some pedigree in inter-state affairs. It wasn't that surprising I was asked to do the vetting, despite a bit unusual, since this new sect was from the west. It already started spreading in Europe but wasn't anything serious yet. I was not surprised that I was asked to do it. It tracked with my previous work and not a lot of experts of culture/history could write an email, let alone speak fluent english. But something was off because my expertise is pretty far from what I had to investigate later.

I recieved a handler, or at least someone who had access to (for example) interpol data and who asked the questions which we needed to find an answer for. He was sent by a subsidiary of the cultural ministry. We also got ahold of someone who works closely with an existing unofficial catholic sect (well unofficial in the vatican-sense but full privilege in our country - he was basically a popular, for profit pastor like in the US but without the TV show). Turned out this guy we found, who is the assistant of a pastor was approached by the cult I am investigating with something strange.

I started to investigate the sect, I was listening to publicly available footages, reading pamphlets, trying to find out what I am missing because it felt fishy. I was looking for tax reports and other corporate documents from different countries all over the World. Tried to find out how many people are decision makers, what money they make and where they put it. But after a while it became clear that this is more than that. We are trying to find out if the sect is a national security risk or not. Never was this a concern, it was odd.

I remember having a conversation about this when the pastor's assistant came into picture. I was told of him by the handler. After we met he hinted that he never mentioned he was contacted by the sect to people other than his pastor. According to him either the sect self-reported themselves or it must have been a wiretap on either's phone. Since the "investigation" was steered into natsec territory in the previous weeks I openly discussed this with the "handler" who gave some vague answers that there is a theory that this sect has ulterior motives.

In weeks before this, my scope of investigation was steered from religions speeches to something more akin to a money laundering investigation. I was even asked if I can find someone who is in some sort of power, who has a contact with the sect and had a change in behaviour since coming into contact. This was unlike anything I ever worked before. It was like a spy movie. A pretty boring one but compared to what I did otherwise this was thrilling actually.

At this point I am pretty sure the reader can guess the sect's name. It is called Scientology.

What keeps me up at night is a sentence from the pastor's assistant which never left me. I do not really consider him the most trustworthy witness or completely sane to be honest. But I still cannot find any reason for, or possibility that he just made it up, thanks to him being a bit ashamed or violated due to us knowing about the meeting in the first place. I interviewed him of the meetings on twice occasions, the story remained consistent and most of it was nothing out of the ordinary. Apart from one thing. According to the pastor's assistant they told him:

"We can teach your Group how to pray to angels to summon them".

I shared the disbelief of the assistant. Christians, no matter if catholics or not, do not worship or pray to angels. I tried to argue that it might be different in the west, but then the assistant said they did not speak figuratively. They actually tried to show it a few days later but the pastor refused any further contact so the assistant refused the "experiment". I was pretty sceptical but the assistant insisted that it was not a figure of speech. They literally tried to show them how to summon angels.

After we dug up most of what we could about the sect we got a pretty good idea that this is a religion second but a secret society first. Scientology did not receive the "official religion status" in my country, it could not become a church. The official position is that Scientology is using people as assets to gain more followers, possibly with blackmails received via the interrogation efforts called "cleansing" (direct translation, might have a different english name). But the unofficial explanation I got from the handler is darker. He claims it looks like Scientology is trying to infiltrate media and politics especially. They are deliberately doing what a foreign actor would do if trying to influence a country. And the endgoal is not clear, does not seem like it is money since they reinvest almost everything.

20+ years later this memory hit me hard. It was during a video I watched. A few weeks ago I listened to the news, it said there are drones all over Germany, Britain and the US and they are unidentified. Then I learned about the egg video, and I read some stuff I was sent. And then the youtube algorithm showed me a video where someone talked about the drones, like it was obvious they are aliens. A bunch of red flags, I reported them all.

It turned out he was busy in the last 20 years aswell. He is not rushing to disclose his affiliation to Scientology but he managed to start a UFO-company with a rockstar.

In the past few days I tried to learn about the "lore" of ufology. I learned about the NYT article, what came of it, and it was obvious that the entire topic is sprinkled with what people call the "woo". Remote

viewing, CE5, telepathy. I see a trend calling "aliens" angels and demons. Turns out we can summon them and people call them angels. But this is so familiar, I already had these arguments and questions 20+ years ago.

My experience happened thousands of miles from the US. It happened two decades before. And yet everything is the same. Hal Puthoff tries to convince people that he can summon angels. What are the odds?

My conclusion is this: The entire topic, ufology since 2017 is basically a conspiracy against people. But it is not a conspiracy about aliens or telepathy. Just the usual: power. Old religions are not able to control people anymore, noone is afraid of God in 2025. But convincing people that science cannot answer the big questions, that you just need to open your mind to reach an omnipotent source of consciousness... Well that is not a new idea either, but it Works.

My opinion is that ufology today is a conspiracy by a) some political groups; b) Scientology; c) economic interest groups. Their goal is to replace both religions and critical thinking skills with a chaotic idea about an alien god. Let's call it Xenu. I think the endgoal is the same as always. Power, control, money, etc.

I am not very well read into ufology. I might have missed details. Please feel free to correct or inform me. Feel free to discuss. But for the love of God, please do not try to pain Puthoff in a good light, I can tell he only got worse since my report. Best course of action would be to try to prove or disprove the connection between "people and corporations of ufology" and the church of Scientology. For example, NewsNation is pushing the topic like there is no tomorrow. They are owned by Nexstar, just like 50 other media outlets. Google: "nexstar scientology". Not only they share scientologist press releases (thousands of them) but a lot of employees seem to sympathise with them. I would say it's odd but this is old News for me...

Thanks for reading. Aliens might exist, but Hal Puthoff or his remote viewing antics has nothing to do with them. I haven't used English for a while now, I hope the text is understandable. Have a nice day guys.

I agree a lot of new age ideology is cultish, but as one who actually experiences many of the things it talks about I can't agree with your general assessment.
